REREC participates in Sustainable **Energy Conference**

REREC's top Management led by the CEO CPA Peter Mbugua this week joined other participants from the Energy Sector and other players drawn from the renewable energy and financial institutions in Africa during the continent's inaugural sustainable energy conference held at Olkaria in Naivasha.

The Sustainable Energy Conference 2022, whose theme was 'Renewable Energy for Sustainable Development' provided a platform that brought together global investors and policymakers in oil, gas and power together for the first-ever summit held in Kenya to discuss challenges hampering efforts to scale up the use of clean energy and brainstorm on relevant remedial measures.

Speaking during the event, Ministry of Energy Amb. Monica Juma, who is also the acting CS for Petroleum told participants at the two day conference that green energy production will go a long way in cushioning millions of Kenyans who are bearing the brunt of the high cost of petroleum products adding that. 'There is need for Kenya to embrace green energy production in the wake of the skyrocketing fuel prices,.

"For Africa to achieve carbon neutrality targets set by the Paris Agreement, the

continent must invest in green energy and avert irreversible damage to ecosystems and livelihoods linked to temperature rise," said Juma.

Delagates were in agreement that the continent's green energy transition hinged on innovative financing and friendly regulations.

The two-day event was organised by the Ministry of Energy, Nation Media Group, the Kenya Electricity Generating Company (KenGen).
