In keeping with its mission of providing sustainable energy solutions for all through rural electrification and renewable energy for social economic transformation, REREC has been working with several county governments to provide street lighting infrastructure.

Street lighting is not only an enabler for extended economic activities, but also a way of providing a safe and secure environment where locals can live, trade and work for extended periods without fear of insecurity.

Driven by this need, REREC, in partnership with the County Government of Kajiado, launched a massive drive to identify and electrify several commercially viable streets within the county’s environs. This culminated in the commissioning of 211 street lights at various locations in Ongata Rongai, Olkeri and Ngong Wards in Kajiado North Constituency. A switching on ceremony for the KShs 25million street lighting project took place recently and was witnessed by representatives from REREC and Kajiado county government.
